#### Biography

Hervey DeWitt Griswold was born May 24, 1860 in Dryden, New York to Benjamin and Laura Eliza (Hurd) Griswold. He attended Union College in Schenectady, New York 1881 – 1885, and then attended Union Theological Seminary in New York City 1885 – 1888. For the next two years, he had a fellowship at Oxford and Berlin Universities. Griswold began his service for the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in India 1890 as a local missionary in Jhansi. That same year, he also married Frances S. Sheldon. Together they would have three children: Laura Katharine; Arthur Sheldon; and Frances Louise.

In 1894, Griswold became Professor of Philosophy at Forman Christian College in Lahore, India, also teaching History and English. Griswold built the Foreman Christian College Library as its Librarian, adding greatly to the selection of books on philosophy and religion. He served as secretary of the India Council of the Presbyterian Missions. Griswold continued his own education, earning a PhD from Cornell University in 1900 with his thesis on Indian Philosophy, *Brahman*. He obtained his Doctor of Divinity in 1910. Griswold was a prolific writer, penning a number of pamphlets and other literary works throughout his life.

Griswold retired from missionary work in India in 1926 and died May 11, 1945.

#### **Collection Scope and Content Note**

The collection is organized in three series:

#### • Series 1: Notebooks, 1893 – 1925 (2 boxes, 0.75 lin. ft.)

This series contains the personal handwritten notebooks by Griswold arranged in chronological order. The notebooks function as diaries where they discuss the everyday thoughts of Griswold.

There are also books that Griswold called "studies" which focus on one passage and expound upon its meaning. The final type of notebook is the prayer books, also handwritten. These books are dated and include what Griswold was thankful for or prayed about on a specific day.

#### • Series 2: Correspondence, 1925 – 1941 (1 box, 0.125 lin. ft.)

Within this series is correspondence between various people in India, and Griswold. Mr. Ray H. Carter was of the Presbyterian Mission in Lahore, India writing to Griswold in Philadelphia. Daniel J. Fleming was writing from Union Theological Seminary in New York to the Griswold's in Bridgeport, Connecticut. Other letters from Reverend E. Morris Wherry and Union graduate C. H. Mattison are also included. Mattison included a copy of a letter to a Dr. Beattie imploring for financial support. The final letter is from Sir Manohar Lal, finance minister of the Punjab Province in India.

 <u>Series 3: Sermons and Essays, 1897 – 1925 (1 box, 0.125 lin. ft.)</u> Within this series are two essays and four published sermons written and delivered by Griswold.

#### Processing

Metal clips and staples were removed from materials and folded items were flattened. Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper as needed. Notebooks were wrapped in acid-free tissue and tied with acid-free cotton tying tape.

An inventory was compiled by Paul A. Byrnes, Spring 1977. The full finding aid was created with an updated inventory by Brigette C. Kamsler, December 2011.

#### **Further Sources**

Many of Griswold's published works are available for research, including *India Awakening*, 1912; *Catechism on Christian Giving*, 1912; and *India, After the War, in India*, 1919.

Cornell University Library's Division of Rare and Manuscript Collections have a Griswold Collection which includes Dr. Griswold's "Autobiographical Notes, prepared for his descendants" (247 pp., 1938-40); two printed copies of Griswold's studies of Hinduism; five typed or printed items pertaining to his career as a missionary at Forman Christian College, Lahore, India (now Pakistan); pamphlet "Sketches of My Indian Childhood" by Frances Griswold Wooddell (116 pp., n.d.); genealogical pamphlet on the Griswold family of Dryden, New York; and typescript poems by Hervey De Witt Griswold (28 pp.).
