

History

The Nestorian tablet is a stone monument in Sianfu, Shensi, China. It was found in 1625 by Chinese laborers. Its text, in Syriac and Chinese, relates the Nestorian Christian missions in China from 635 to 781, the year during which the tablet was erected.

The original tablet is now in the Forest of Stones Museum in Xi'an, China.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the printed copy of the stone tablet, showing only the Chinese text, and the envelope in which it was received from China. The envelope is stamped 1937.

Processing

The tablet copy was partially unfolded and put in a larger box.
