

### **Biography**

Charles Tudor Leber (1898 – 1959) was a native of Baltimore, Maryland. He attended Baltimore City College and later Johns Hopkins University. Leber earned his Doctorate of Divinity at Princeton's Theological Seminary studying under J. Ross Stevens. Leber was ordained as a minister in the Presbyterian Church of Baltimore in 1923 and served first in Trenton, New Jersey. That same year also saw Leber marry his wife nee Eloise Heath. Shortly following his ordination Leber moved back to Baltimore in 1924 and became pastor of the Forest Park Presbyterian Church.

In 1936, Leber was called to serve the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions as secretary for Japan, Korean, the Philippines and Thailand. Following his service to the Board of Foreign Missions in that capacity Leber served as General Secretary of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church of the United States of America beginning in 1952. During his tenure with the Board of Foreign Missions Dr. Leber circumnavigated the globe three times paying visits to many of the countries in Europe, Africa, Asia as well as North, Central and South America.

Dr. Leber died of a heart attack in 1959, at the age of 60, while attending the 18<sup>th</sup> General Council of the World Presbyterian Alliance in Sao Paolo Brazil.

#### **Collection Scope and Content Note**

The collection contains typed correspondence written Charles Tudor Leber describing his travels under the auspices of the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions in 1944 – 1945 and 1953. Letters were arranged by month and year.

Leber visited Central and South America in 1944-1945 including the following countries: Mexico, Guatemala, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Chile, Argentina, Brazil and Venezuela. His trip

of 1953 took Leber through post-war India, Pakistan, Germany (East and West portions of Berlin), Spain, Thailand, Japan, Korea, Taiwan, Indonesia, the Philippines, Hong Kong and Singapore. Leber's letters described the countries, people and environments both social and economic he traversed. They illustrate the nature of travel in the mid-20<sup>th</sup> Century and also illuminate the work of missionaries.

#### **Processing**

It should be noted certain place names are described below according to earlier spelling conventions. When applicable, contemporary spellings of place names are provided in [brackets].

Metal clips and staples were removed from materials and folded items were flattened. Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper as needed. Any items in an advanced state of deterioration were placed in Mylar envelopes.
