

direction of Charles H. Fahs, who was research assistant to John R. Mott and curator of the Missionary Research Library from its foundation in 1914 until 1948, these records were moved with the MRL to the Brown Memorial Tower of Union Theological Seminary in 1929. History

The majority of Christians in Latin America identify as Catholic, as Catholicism arrived over five centuries ago. Protestant missions in Latin America began in the mid-1800s with missionaries arriving from North America and Europe. In 1910, the World Missionary Conference was held in Edinburgh, Scotland. Although the slogan for the 1910 meeting was, "the evangelization of the world is our generation," Latin America was not considered a mission field as the Catholics had already proclaimed the area Christian.

Others did not agree with this standpoint, and organized the Committee of Cooperation in Latin America, which supported a group of Protestants to hold a conference in Panama in 1916. It was after this conference that Protestant mission work in Latin America became more important. The spreading of the gospels in Latin America is also credited with the rise in social justice and other considerations. The 160,000 Protestants in 1916 has grown to over 50 million today.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of a wide variety of mission-related topics in Latin America, all collected by the Missionary Research Library. The Missionary Research Library (MRL) began after it was decided at the 1910 World Missionary Conference that there was a need for a central library, to serve as a depository for information on missions and as a reference and research took for

mission boards. MRL officially opened in June 1914 and was intended for use by a variety of people and organizations: missionaries on furlough and in the field; those in missionary organizations or on mission boards; professors of missions and students studying the topic; scholars; anthropologists; the government; other libraries; and the general public. It is therefore not surprising that the MRL Archives contain not only specific collections for individuals and organizations, but on the general happenings of mission work in a specific geographic location.

The Latin American General Records are organized by topic, including Christianity, education, evangelism, education, Indians, organizations, conferences, geographic locations, imperialism and labor conditions. The materials show the wide variety of concerns related to mission work in Latin America. The two oversize boxes contain blueprints for the *Hospital Evangelico* in Buenos Aires, which was part of the Board of Christian Work. Some of the material could be source items for the Committee on Cooperation in Latin America, but the theory could not be proven.

Processing

Folded materials were flattened. Staples, rubber bands, and metal clips were removed and replaced with plastic clips. All materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes.

In 2014, the collection was updated as part of the Henry Luce Foundation grant. During that time, materials were added from a group of unprocessed and unorganized material. The original selection of papers is now housed in box 1. Additional material is available in the subsequent boxes. In 2014, the collection was also renamed "Latin American General Records," originally called "Latin American Miscellaneous Papers." Future additions of material is possible.
