Biography

Charles Eli Bronson was born in Geneva, New York on December 6, 1857 to parents Eli Atwater and Amelia (Kellogg) Bronson. He obtained his Bachelor of Arts from Amherst College in 1880 before attending Union Theological Seminary, where he earned his diploma in 1884. He was ordained in the No-River Presbytery on November 6, 1884, and immediately embarked on a three decade-long ministerial career in the Midwest and Northeast. During his career, he served as a pastor in Marlborough, New York (1884-1892); Saginaw, Michigan (1892-1900), at West Hope Presbyterian Church from 1900-1922. In 1894, Bronson went on to receive his Doctorate of Divinity from Alma College in Alma, Michigan.

In addition to his ministerial work, Reverend Bronson served as President of the Philadelphia School of Christian Workers beginning in 1923, and was a member of Psi Upsilon and the Union League of Philadelphia. He married Amey Talbot Taintor – herself a graduate of Smith College, Columbia College and native of Stratford, Connecticut – in 1898, and had two children together.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The Bronson Papers are divided into two series showing the natural distinction found between Bronson's sermon-related writings, and the textual materials relating to his personal and family life:

• Series 1: Writings, [1884]-1930 (1 box, 0.5 lin. ft.)

This series contains Bronson's sermons as they were gathered by year. Note that many early sermons were revised and preached at various points in Bronson's pastorate, so many sermons include annotations with multiple locations and dates.

Series 2: Personal, 1845-1966 (2 boxes, 0.75 lin. ft.)

This series comprises the personal effects, personal materials and genealogical research undertaken within Bronson's immediate and extended families. This series includes subheadings to gesture to these divisions, notably the division between Bronson's personal notebooks, Bibles and clippings; the personal effects belonging to immediate relatives such as his wife and children; and the genealogical research conducted by extended relations to Bronson, including the Taintor, Talbot, and Bewley families.

Processing

Metal clips and staples were removed from materials and folded items were flattened. Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper as needed. Any items in an advanced state of deterioration were placed in Mylar envelopes.
