

Biography

Reverend Doctor Ezra H. Gillet was born in Colchester, Connecticut in 1828. He graduated from Yale College in 1841, then from Union Theological Seminary in 1844 where he continued his theological studies until his ordination in the Presbyterian Church in 1845. After his ordination his served as the pastor for the First Presbyterian Church at Harlem for 20 years.

In 1864 he received his doctorate from Hamilton College and then served as a professor of Political Economy at New York University. Re. Dr. Gillet has penned many biographical and historical books including *Life and Works of John Huss, History of the Presbyterian Church, and The Moral System.* Ezra was the father of Charles Ripley Gillett, noted librarian of Union Theological Seminary.

Ezra Hall Gillett died on September 2, 1875 of a "nervous fevered, engendered by a severe attack of rheumatism."

Collection Scope and Content Note

The collection is organized in three series:

• Series 1: Manuscript Sermons, 1844-1875 (9 boxes, 4.25 lin. ft.)

This series contains handwritten sermons that are numbered. The numbering system is not always complete. Gillett kept various groupings of sermons together, and gave some of the groupings volume numbers. There can be multiple volume numbers, although the individual sermon numbers are unique. The titles of the sermons as well as the location the sermon was given are often written onto the cover of the sermon booklets.

- Subseries 1A: Ely H. Gillett Sermons, 1797-1828 (1 box, 0.25 lin. ft.)
 This series contains the sermons of Ezra's father, Ely H. Gillett. These sermons are the oldest in the collection.
- <u>Series 2: Other Writing, 1843-1906 (3 boxes, 1.25 lin. ft.)</u>
 Within this series are a number of other handwritten pieces and documents by Ezra, including town descriptions, a diary, notes on themes and other collections of writings.
- Series 3: Teaching and Class Notes, 1839-1872 (2 boxes, 1.00 lin. ft.)

 Ezra Hall Gillett appeared to have taken a personal study of the Law, both nationally and internationally. Included in this series are those handwritten notes from various aspects of the law that Gillett studied. There are also other class notes from Yale as well as the University of the City of New York.

Processing

Metal clips and staples were removed from materials and folded items were flattened. Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper and folders as needed.
