Abstract: Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus, known as Christian Feminism Today, or EEWC-CFT, is an international organization of women and men which supports, educates and celebrates Christian Feminists, through biennial conferences, local chapters, regional events and internet sources. Collection contains newsletters, newsletter editor files, board member notes, chapter files and organizational correspondence.

Organization History

The Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus has a long and productive history advocating for gender equality, and the rights of women in the Church and in society. Comprised of women and men who believe that the Bible supports the full equality of the sexes, the Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus (EEWC) seeks to support all Christians in responding to God's call in their lives. The EEWC achieves this through the mutual support and networking of Christian feminists from many traditions. The encouragement and advocacy for the use of women's gifts in all forms of Christian vocation is central to the organization. In addition, an integral function of the EEWC is providing educational opportunities for Christian feminists to grow in their beliefs and their understanding of both their faith and the critical issues

facing Christian feminists. As such, the EEWC welcomes everyone with an extensive non-discrimination policy.

These goals are met through the utilization of local chapters, regional events, biennial conferences (incorporating lectures, workshops, music, and worship), and its website/newsletter, *Christian Feminism Today* (CFT). CFT provides Christian feminist news, articles, book reviews, blogs, Bible study, audio, links to explore, and inspiration.

The structure of the EEWC centers on its membership. The membership of the EEWC drives activities as much as do the Executive Council. Focus groups and local chapters report to the Executive Council; however, it is the work of these smaller groups that address and implement EEWC efforts.

The Evolution of EEWC from ESA to EEWC-CFT

Founded in 1973 as a caucus of the Evangelicals for Social Action (ESA), the EEWC was originally named the Evangelical Women's Caucus (EWC). While under the auspices of Evangelicals for Social Action, the Evangelical Women's Caucus presented proposals on a variety of topics: including the endorsement of the Equal Rights Amendment, support for inclusive language in Bible translations and in Christian publications, affirmation of the ordination of women, and criticism of discriminatory hiring policies in Christian institutions.

In its first foray out of the ESA, the EWC associated with another feminist organization, the Daughters of Sarah. Daughters of Sarah supported the EWC through shared resources. In 1975, the EWC organized its first national conference, "Women in Transition: Biblical Approach to Feminism," in Washington DC. This conference was attended by 360 women and men from the US and Canada. International conferences have been held regularly annually or biennially within the USA since that date.

In 1978 EWC became self-sufficient with the incorporation and institution of by-laws. This organizational change moved the EWC from a network of autonomous chapters into an incorporated nonprofit organization.

In the mid-1980s the EWC was often cited as the Evangelical Woman's Caucus (or Coalition) International, or EWCI. The mid-1980s were crucial to the development of the EEWC. Starting in 1984, involvement in pressing socio-political issues became a key movement. The 1986 conference in Fresno saw the passing of three resolutions in support of the rights of racial minorities, victims of domestic violence and the burgeoning LGBT community. This caused friction between members who believed that politics should be excluded from the organization, and those members who felt that justice for all persons was central to their faith.

In 1990, reflecting the increasingly inclusive nature and many traditions of their membership, EWC/EWCI was renamed the Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus (EEWC). This remains the incorporated name. In addition, the organizational structure was changed from membership in local chapters to membership in the national organization with regional representatives serving on the National Council.

Since 2009, the EEWC has become increasingly associated with the title of their magazine, *Christian Feminism Today*. At the 2009 annual meeting, the EEWC officially became the EEWC-Christian Feminism Today (EEWC-CFT).

Collection Scope and Content Note

The records of EEWC consist of the organization's general administrative files, personal files of several key members of the organization, as well as conference and publication records. The primary contributors have been: Britt Vanden Eykel, Virginia Hearn, Debbie Jang, Kaye Cook, Catherine Bailey, Joyce Q. Erickson, and S. Sue Horner. The bulk of materials in this collection span the 1980s and 1990s. The majority of the collection consists of files from local chapters as well as from individual members of the organization. Files with clear sources have the donor listed. Correspondence, social and political issues of particular import and conference records are central to this collection. The papers also include copies of national publications, conference realia and audio recordings of plenary sessions from national conferences.

The collection is divided into 5 series:

- **Series 1: EEWC Administrative Records, 1971-2012 (20 Boxes, 3 Half Boxes, 10.75 Lin. Ft.)**

This series provides information on how and why the Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus was founded; their by-laws and the development of the organization. Included are the National and Executive Council minutes, their financial records from the beginning to 2011, lists of their members, and correspondence to and from the National office and the field directors from the different chapters.

- **Subseries 1A: Foundation and By-laws, 1976-2010 (1 Half Box, 0.25 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries includes the first by-laws of 1978 and all following revisions to by-laws. From these documents it is possible to follow the changes made to the structure of the organization as it developed. Folders are arranged in chronological order.

- **Subseries 1B: Council and Committees, 1974-2012 (6 Boxes, 3.00 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries consists of National and Executive Council minutes, correspondence between board members, fliers and articles relevant to discussions. A copy of the proposals made at Evangelicals for Social Action in 1974 which led to the creation of the original EWC can be found at the beginning

of this subseries in Box 1 Folder 1. A policy and procedure manual can be found in Series 1C Box 7 Folder 6.

Throughout the years there were many temporary committees, such as Steering, Fundraising, Nominating, Conference, and Publications committees which were created to deal with specific issues. A temporary Steering Committee operated from 1975-1977. From 1978 when the organization was formally incorporated this was replaced by the National Council. The Steering Committee was however reinstated in 1980 and continued to 1988.

The Fundraising Committee was created to reach out to different foundations to help raise funds. The Lilly Endowment, Inc. and Christian Investments Foundation were among the foundations which they approached.

A Publications Committee existed from approximately 1983-1988 and was created to gather a team to plan and produce the newsletter *Update*. Included are employment contracts and correspondence about the positions which were to be filled.

The bulk of folders within this section contain documents in their original reversed date order. Researchers are requested not to rearrange this order.

- **Subseries 1C: National Office-Field Director/ Coordinator, 1974-2010 (9 Boxes, 1 Half Box, 4.75 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries consists of memos and other correspondence from the National office to the National Coordinator. Originally multiple copies of Robert's Rules of Order were sent to and from the National Office; these duplicates have been reduced to one copy. The field director received newsletters/reports from chapters and for clarity these can be found in the chapter sections of Series 4. Folders in this subseries are arranged in chronological order from 1974-2010 with sub-headers indicating the name of the national coordinator or EEWC organizer at a particular period.

- **Subseries 1D: Financial Records, 1978-2011 (3 Boxes, 1.50 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries contains budget reports that are arranged chronologically. The annual reports appear first, followed by quarterly and monthly reports. Also included are tax forms, tax exemption forms, and financial ledgers. The bulk of folders within this section contain documents in their original reversed date order. Researchers are requested not to rearrange this order.

- **Subseries 1E: Membership, 1971-2007 (2 Boxes, 1 Half Box, 1.25 Lin.Ft.)**

[Boxes 1-3 Restricted until January 1st 2065] This subseries in boxes 1-3 contains lists of the members throughout the organization with their full contact information. The membership section continues with a group of projects, books, and other works written by members and friends.

- **Series 2: Newsletters, 1977 – 2012 (11 Boxes, 5.50 Lin. Ft.)**

Early in the existence of EEWC a newsletter was developed to be sent out to all members. Four newsletters a year were produced and distributed to every member on the mailing list. Editorial records include correspondence about topical ideas, articles, and financial records relating to the publication of the newsletters. Currently EEWC have a website, which includes podcasts and blogs. However, in addition to their website, the organization continues to produce a paper newsletter four times a year.

- **Subseries 2A: Newsletters, 1977 – 2012 (6 Boxes, 3.00 Lin. Ft.)**

The subseries contains copies of the original national newsletter and continues into its later versions- EEWC Update and Christian Feminism Today. Issues from 1977 through 2012 appear by title and format. Also included are additional papers circulated with the Newsletter mailings, 1984-1986. Letha Scanzoni 's donation in July 2013 of newsletters, letters, and other related editor's notes for 1994-2012 have been added to this section, which now includes additional preparatory information for the production of the newsletters.

- **Subseries 2B: Editorial Records, 1977 – 2011 (5 Boxes, 2.50 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries consists of the national publication's editorial records and correspondence. Files dating 1982 - 1994 and belonging to Deborah Jang, Virginia Hearn and Ann Moor are included. Financial records from the national publication are also included.

- **Series 3: Conferences, 1975 – 2012 (7 AV Boxes, 1 Half Box, 6.75 Lin. Ft.)**

Since their founding, every two years, the EEWC has held a conference to discuss a range of specific issues. Conferences were held at different locations each year and would always be recorded. The conference presentations are recorded on audio cassettes, CDs, and DVDs. Conference promotional items, such as tote bags, buttons, and posters were also produced.

- **Subseries 3A: Conference Records, 1975 – 2010 (6 Boxes, 3.00 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries consists of the planning, programing, advertising and organizational files for national conferences. Conference records are from a variety of cities where conferences were held, including Chicago and San Francisco. In 2013 Letha Scanzoni donated additional conference records and plans covering conferences in the years 1975-2010.

- **Subseries 3B: Presentations, 1978 – 2006 (7 AV Boxes, 1 Half Box, 3.25 Lin. Ft.)**

This subseries consists of the speeches, audio and video recordings of the conferences plenary sessions and photographs taken at the national conferences.

One audio cassette from a 1985 Evangelistic Association of New England (E.A.N.E.) congress is included. As this is the only item which refers to 1985 and the EEWC did not appear to hold a conference in that year, it is inferred that an

EEWC member may have attended this conference and included the recording with the other EEWC conference cassettes.

- **Subseries 3C: Promotional Items, 1975 – 2012 (1 Box, 0.50 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of media and promotional items for the national conferences, including entrance badges, advertising posters, informational pamphlets, pens, and buttons. Any oversized materials such as posters and a banner can be found in larger containers in Series 5A.
- **Series 4: EEWC Chapter Records 1976-2010 (7 Boxes, 5 Half Boxes, 4.75 Lin. Ft.)**
Not long after the creation of the EEWC, locally based chapters were developed covering different areas throughout the United States. Many chapters were created in the early years, while others were created several years after the initial founding. Some chapters started for specific reasons and only lasted for short periods of time. The records of chapters in this series usually contain correspondence between members and information to and from the National office. Some chapters produced their own publications, which were local and separate from the National newsletter.
- **Subseries 4A: Bay Area, 1976-2003 (1 Box, 0.50 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Bay Area Chapter, which was founded in 1974. Foundational documents are included in addition to correspondence, topical research and copies of chapter publications. The chapter's newsletter was re-named Green Leaf in 1981. Much of the correspondence contains attachments such as pamphlets or circulars advertising events of the chapter. This chapter also collected publications from other organizations in the Bay Area.
- **Subseries 4B: Greater Boston, 1976-1996 (2 Boxes, 1 Half Box, 1.25 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Greater Boston Chapter, which was founded in 1978. A major portion of these materials were provided by Sue Horner. Organizational documents are included in addition to correspondence, event information and copies of chapter publications.
- **Subseries 4C: Chicago, 1983-2010 (1 Box, 0.50 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Chicago Chapter founded in 1983. A significant section of these materials were provided by Juanita Wright Potter.
- **Subseries 4D: Indiana, 1983-2004 (1 Half Box, 0.25 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Indiana Chapter founded in 1983.
- **Subseries 4E: Michigan, 1976-1992 (1 Half Box, 0.25 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Michigan Chapter founded in 1976.

- **Subseries 4F: Seattle, 1976-1990 (1 Box, 0.50 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the Seattle Chapter founded in 1976.
- **Subseries 4G: Southwest, 1976-1990 (1 Box, 1 Half Box, 0.75 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of Chapter and Board meeting files, conferences and events, newsletter publications from the Southwest Region Chapter founded in 1976.
- **Subseries 4H: Washington DC, 1976-1986 (1 Half Box, 0.25 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from the DC Chapter founded in 1976.
- **Subseries 4I: General, 1976-1986 (1 Box, 0.50 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of files, documents and publications from a range of EEWC's smaller or transitory Chapters such as NJ, OK, PA, TN, Portland and Minnesota.
- **Series 5: Oversized Records, [1949?]-2012 (2 Tubes, 2 OS Horizontal Box, 1 Half Box, 11.25 Lin. Ft.)**
Throughout the collection, many posters and ephemera were too large to be housed in a traditional archives box and were separated into larger containers for preservation reasons in this series. Also included is Victoria Booth Demarest robe and bible. Demarest was ordained a minister in 1949 and passed away at the age of 93 in 1982.
- **Subseries 5A: Articles and Posters, 1974-2012 (2 Tubes, 1 OS Horizontal Box, 8.00 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of outsize research articles, informational materials for national conferences and local chapter events, and articles written by EEWC members. All items placed in this series have been noted in the Series and Subseries from which this material was drawn from.
- **Subseries 5B: Victoria Booth Demarest, [1949?]-1982 (1 OS Horizontal Box, 1 Half Box, 3.25 Lin. Ft.)**
This subseries consists of the Demarest Robe, Bible, and a list of books written by Victoria Booth Demarest.

Processing

When the Burke Library acquired EEWC Records, an attempt was made to maintain the original order of these records. Folded materials were flattened. Newspaper clippings were photocopied on acid free paper. Staples, rubber bands, and metal clips were removed. All materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes.
