Abstract: Sam Horace Franklin, Jr., missionary to Japan with wife Dorothy,

director and pastor of Delta and Providence Cooperative Farms Inc., Miss., chaplain in US Naval Reserve, then acting secretary for Presbyterian Church of the USA Board of Foreign Missions. Professor of Christian Social Ethics in Tokyo Union Theological Seminary where Dorothy served as Dean of Women and taught English. Collection contains extensive correspondence forming a detailed biography with photographs, sermons

and publications.

Biography

Sam Horace Franklin, Jr. was born in Dandridge, TN, September 23, 1902. A graduate of Maryville College (1924) and McCormick Theological Seminary (1929), he met Dorothy Winters at Maryville College. Dorothy attended Maryville College from 1921-1925 where she served as the president of the YWCA. Upon graduating Dorothy served as the secretary of the YWCA in Cortland, N.Y. Sam and Dorothy married on April 29, 1927. In 1928, they traveled to Scotland to study at Edinburgh University and in 1929 embarked on mission work for the Presbyterian Church in Japan. Both their children, Kathleen and John, were born in Japan. Sam Franklin established Fellowship House in their home in Kyoto in 1929, opening their home for kindergarten classes, fellowship services, and Bible study groups.

Sam received his STM degree from Union Theological Seminary in 1935. Sam and Dorothy then sought to return to Japan but Toyohiko Kagawa and other Japanese friends advised them not to return to the unstable Japanese political climate. Reinhold Niebuhr recommended that Sam be selected to be the Vice President of the farming co-operative which both Niebuhr and Sherwood Eddy were involved in establishing to help sharecroppers and tenant farmers in Mississippi. From 1936-1941, Sam and Dorothy worked with the Delta and Providence Cooperative Farms, a groundbreaking effort to promote interracial equality and understanding through shared labor. Sam was the Vice President (while Reinhold Niebuhr was President) and Sam also worked as the Chaplain and Resident Operations Manager of the Farm. He continued to be involved on the Board for several years after he left the farms.

In 1942, after the attacks on Pearl Harbor, Sam joined the Navy as a chaplain, and worked with soldiers in the 25th N.C. Battalion. In 1944, he was transferred to the Mariana Islands and while there, he worked both with US soldiers and with Japanese prisoners of war. He presented lectures to the soldiers, reflecting his positive experiences with Japanese people and Japanese culture. He assisted the military by speaking with Japanese prisoners of war in their own language, and conducting Bible studies in prisons and hospitals. During the war Dorothy continued work at the farm co-operative. In 1946 Sam Franklin returned to work in Chicago for the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church, USA.

When the Franklins returned to Japan in 1947, at the insistence of the Foreign Board of Missions, both Sam and Dorothy taught at Tokyo Union Theological Seminary. Sam was Professor of Christian Social Ethics. Dorothy taught English, and later became the Dean of

Women. She directed Saffron House, a home for self-supporting blind women and received an honorary doctorate from Tokyo Union Theological Seminary.

After the war, the Franklins helped establish a cooperative farm in Japan based on their experience with sharecroppers in Mississippi. When the Franklins retired from mission work in 1969. Dorothy received the Emperor's prestigious Fourth Order of the Sacred Treasure award while Sam received the Fifth Order award at the same time.

Following his retirement, Sam Franklin worked during the 1970s with Hebron Presbyterian Church as an interim pastor. He also campaigned against racism and the nuclear threat, and began preparations for a book on the Cooperative farm movement during this time.

Sam and Dorothy took progressive stances on a wide range of social and economic issues. For example, their engagement in the farming cooperative through discussion with Reinhold Niebuhr radically embraced the idea of a racially integrated community, an extremely controversial idea in the South. While in Japan, the Franklins passionately advocated for women seeking higher education. In addition, later in life, Sam and Dorothy worked tirelessly to promote pacifism and to end nuclear proliferation.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The Franklin papers consist primarily of correspondence accompanied by photographs, sermons and publications covering much of the adult life of Sam Franklin, 1924 – 1994 and Dorothy Franklin, 1924-1993. Kathleen Todd (daughter) has dated several letters throughout the collection. These dates are written on the papers in the top right corner or on the back. The arrangement within each series is chronological.

The collection is divided into 10 series, with two sub-series:

Series 1: Early Years Correspondence, 1910-36 (5 boxes, 2.5 linear ft.)

Series contains correspondence from three distinct periods in the life of Sam and Dorothy. Education, 1910-28: This contains correspondence dating from the time when Dorothy and Sam were students. Dorothy went to college at Maryville College, and worked for the YWCA while Sam went to McCormick Seminary.

First Trip to Japan, 1929-36: Correspondence and documents from Sam and Dorothy's first mission appointment to Japan. During this period Sam and Dorothy provided support and education for Japanese Christians. They also performed important outreach to some of the poorest populations of Tokyo. While in Japan the Franklins became friends with Toyohiko Kagawa.

Sam's European Survey, 1935: Correspondence during the time in which Sam traveled through Europe observing the various political and economic systems in Europe.

Series 2: Delta, Providence Co-Operative Farms (DCF), 1936-70, (4 boxes, 1.75 linear ft.)

Series 2 consists of correspondence, addresses, articles, photographs and some records relating to the operation and concerns of the farm during this period. Some papers relate to the Willie McGee case of 1951 and the 1954 crisis on the farm caused by their public statement that "segregation is unchristian". In addition to Sam and Dorothy, Sherwood Eddy and Reinhold Niebuhr contribute frequently.

This series is split into two sections. The first contains correspondence from the period, arranged in chronological order. The second section contains administrative files and records from this period, again arranged in chronological order.

Series 3: Navy Chaplaincy, 1942-1954 (4 boxes, 2 linear ft.)

- Subseries 3A: Correspondence, 1942-54, (3 boxes, 1.5 linear ft.) This subseries contains correspondence between Sam and his family while Sam served as a Navy Chaplain. After training at the College of William & Mary, Sam shipped out in Feb 1944.
- Subseries 3B, Lectures and Worship Services, 1922-92, (1 box, 0.5 linear ft.) This subseries contains bulletins from services conducted by Sam as a Navy Chaplain. It also contains Sam's notes for theological lectures. All sermons from this period can be found in overall Sermons group in Subseries 6A.

Series 4: Return to Japan, 1946-69 (5 boxes, 2.5 linear ft.)

This series includes correspondence from the Franklins in Illinois, while Sam was working for the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions, through to the period where the Franklins were at Tokyo Union Theological Seminary, with furloughs in the United States. The numbered letters to Dorothy cease in 1947, because Dorothy and John join Sam in Japan. Letters to Kathleen, (called by her father, "Tiddles,") and who is at Wellesley College, predominate from this point forward. Once Dorothy is in Japan, she becomes the primary correspondent to friends and family and there are many letters labeled "Dear Family" and "Dear Friends." In parallel, there are also separate letters signed by Sam. Occasionally there are multiple copies of these letters, possibly sent to Katherine (Sam's sister), Kathleen at Wellesley, and the grandparents. Sometimes a type-written letter to the grandparents has handwritten notes to Kathleen, and vice-versa. There is original water-damage to some letters from Sept – Dec 1947, and occasional later correspondence.

Series 5: Retirement to Tennessee, 1970-94, (1 box, 0.5 linear ft.)

After retiring from Union Theological Seminary in Tokyo, Sam and Dorothy moved back to Tennessee. This series consists mainly of correspondence between Sam and Dorothy and their children and grandchildren during this period.

- Series 6: Sermons and Reflections, 1928-92 (7 boxes, 3.25 linear ft.)
 - Subseries 6A: Sermons, 1928-92, (2 boxes, 0.75 linear ft.) This subseries contains sermons by Sam and Dorothy arranged chronologically. All sermons are by Sam unless otherwise indicated.
 - Subseries 6B, Journals and Diaries, 1922-92, (5 boxes, 2.5 linear ft.) This subseries contains reflections written by Sam and Dorothy arranged chronologically
- Series 7: Publications, 1930-94 (3 boxes, 1.5 linear ft.)

This series contains copies of Sam and Dorothy Franklin's published articles and books, papers and reprints from contacts and a celebratory booklet for Sam Franklin's 90th birthday in 1992 in chronological order.

Series 8: Photographs, 1920-94 (1 box, 0.25 linear ft.)

This series consists of photographs in the collection arranged chronologically

Series 9: General, 1920-94 (1 box, 0.25 linear ft.)

Newspaper clippings by authors other than Sam and Dorothy, maps, service bulletins and other collected items.

Series 10: Outsize items, 1928-51 (1 OS boxes, 2 linear ft.)

This series contains one photograph, newspaper articles, maps, and clippings collected by Sam and Dorothy. These items were relocated from their original locations due to size or condition, and their original place in the collection is indicated in the contents list.

Processing

When the Burke Library acquired the Franklin papers, an attempt was made to maintain the original order. The collection remains largely in the arrangement created by the Franklin family, following a broadly chronological outline. Due a second body of donated material some alterations were made to the original arrangement.

Folded materials were flattened. Photographs were housed in Mylar folders. Staples, rubber bands, and metal clips were removed. All materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes.
