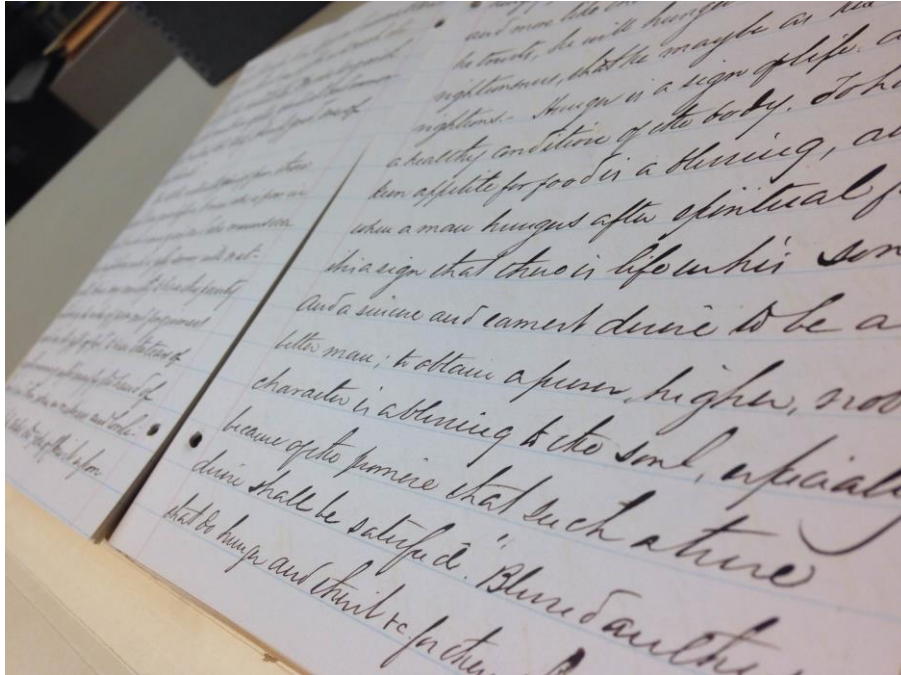

Collection Scope and Content Note

The identity of E. R. Roger is unknown and was not discernible from the collection materials.

The collection contains 750 sermons by E.R. Roger between the 1840s and 1880s. Many of these are numbered though some numbers repeat or numbers are not included. Some of the sermons also include a specific date and location, including cities in the state of Maine such as Hartford or Augusta. Also in the collection are loose sheets of notes, unnumbered sermons, and personal correspondence.

Processing

Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper.
