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### **BASIC ECONOMIC DATA**

Ask about resources: how much land, how many animals?

Ask about possessions: tractors, televisions, motorcycles, telephones, agricultural equipment, etc.

#### Ask about income:

Farm Income: selling grain, selling animals, selling dairy products, etc.

Off-Farm Employment: Who in HH is employed? Where? Doing what? For how long each year? Income?

Other Income: producing something for sale, leasing land or buildings, pension, interest from loans or banks, welfare.

### Ask about expenditures:

Domestic: food, clothing, education, housing, health expenses.

Farm: fertilizer, petrol, seed, fodder, labor, leasing land, etc.

Others: taxes, interest on loans, transportation, rituals, etc.
