#### **Biography**

Nancy A. Hardesty was born on August 22, 1941 in Lima, Ohio. She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from Wheaton College in 1963 and received a Masters degree in newspaper journalism from the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University in 1964. Hardesty worked for both *The Christian Century* and *Eternity* magazines before returning to graduate school, receiving her PhD in 1976. She earned her doctorate in the History of Christianity under the tutelage of Martin Marty at the University of Chicago, titling her thesis "Your Daughters Shall Prophesy': Revivalism and Feminism in the Age of Finney." It was later published in 1991 by Carlson Publishing.

Hardesty's first published book, *All We're Meant to Be: A Biblical Approach to Women's Liberation*, was co-authored with Letha Dawson Scanzoni in 1974 as she was simultaneously working on her doctorate. At this time her career as a speaker burgeoned while she traveled extensively to promote the book, giving addresses on the topics of women's liberation and Biblical feminism within the evangelical Christian movement. All *We're Meant to Be* has been a very significant work, named 23rd of the Top 50 books that have most shaped evangelicals in *Christianity Today* (October 2006), and the book has undergone numerous editions.

Nancy Hardesty began her teaching career at Candler School of Theology at Emory University in 1976 until1980, when she took a break from teaching, working instead as an independent historian, editor and speaker for eight years. She returned to be Professor of religion at Clemson University in Clemson, South Carolina from 1988. Hardesty is a contributing founder of both the Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus in 1975, to which an entire series of her collection is dedicated (See also the EEWC Records collection within the Archives of Women in Theological Scholarship). She also helped to found *Daughters of Sarah*, a Christian feminist newsletter in publication from 1974-1995.

Hardesty is a distinguished author and her publications relate to the role of women in the Christian church. In addition to *All We're Meant to Be* (1974), and *Your Daughters Shall Prophesy* (1991), Hardesty's works include *Women Called to Witness* (1984), *Great Women of* 

Faith (1982), Inclusive Language in the Church (1987), The Memory Book (1989), and most recently, Faith Cure: Divine Healing in the Holiness and Pentecostal Movements (2003).

Some of her other research interests have included adult children of fundamentalists, African-American religion, and women and religion in the South.

#### **Collection Scope and Content Note**

The papers of Nancy A, Hardesty consist of the publications, addresses, correspondence, and other related materials of Hardesty, a church historian and professor of Religion at Clemson University. The materials in this collection span most of her professional career, although the bulk of the material is from the late 1980's and early 1990's.

The majority of the collection consists of correspondence, research, drafts and addresses related to Hardesty's publication. The papers also include personal and professional correspondence, Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus support materials, published articles and clippings from newspapers and magazines.

The collection is divided into eight series:

- Series 1: Tenure application, 1972-1999 (3 boxes, 1.5 lin.ft.)
   Series 1 contains the support material for Hardesty's 1998 application for tenure at Clemson University.
- <u>Series 2: Writings and Publications, 1974-1999 (3 boxes, 1.5 lin. ft.)</u>
   Series 2 includes notes, clippings, drafts, articles, correspondence, book reviews, and records of royalties related to Hardesty's writings and publications. In the records of royalties, copies omitting Hardesty's social security number were substituted for the originals. The arrangement of the series is by title, with materials surrounding each work organized chronologically.
- <u>Series 3: Adult Children of Fundamentalists Research, 1969-1991 (4 boxes, 2 lin. ft.)</u>

Series 3 includes notes, clippings, completed survey questionnaires, preliminary drafts and correspondence regarding the creation of a new book about Adult Children of Fundamentalists (ACOF). An attempt was made to maintain the original sequence of the collection.

• Series 4: Sermons, 1987-1998 (2 boxes, 0.75 lin. ft.)

This series contains the manuscript outlines of sermons given by Hardesty between 1987 and 1998. Arrangement is chronological.

### • Series 5: Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus Conferences, 1975-2002 (2 boxes, 1 lin. ft.)

Series 5 contains notes, brochures, programs, and correspondence relating to the Evangelical and Ecumenical Women's Caucus (EEWC) conferences between 1975 and 2002. The bulk of the material dates from 1990 – 2000.

#### • Series 6: Correspondence, 1984-1995 (2 boxes, 1 lin. ft.)

This series is a collection of personal and professional correspondence, arranged chronologically, including Christmas and birthday cards, as well as professional correspondence with academics and publishing houses. Included are a number of cover letters and resumes submitted to potential employers.

- Series 7: Speeches 1971-1988 (1 box, 0,25 lin. ft.)
  - Series 7 contains a number of Hardesty's early addresses to numerous colleges and universities, mainly student bodies, throughout the country. Early speeches relate to the topic of the single woman in the 1970's. Arrangement is according to the system used by Hardesty to arrange and title these papers.
- Series 8: Personal Correspondence and Journals, 1973- [1993] (1 box, 0.5 lin. ft.) 35 folders restricted until 2041

This series, containing personal correspondence, notes and journals, is RESTRICTED until January 1, 2041.

#### **Processing**

When the Burke Library acquired Hardesty's papers, an attempt was made to maintain the original order she imposed throughout the course of her career.

Folded materials were flattened. Newspaper clippings were photocopied on acid free paper. Staples, rubber bands, and metal clips were removed and replaced with plastic clips. All materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes. Copies have been substituted for originals in order to suppress SSNs in royalty statements.
